Study

Use the following questions for individual study or group discussion. Refer to the Bible passages listed, as well as *The Covenant Story* chapters, as you dig deeper.

Chapter 19
Silence: Covenant Preparation
Luke 1:8-17, 57-80

What did the angel tell Zechariah about his unborn son?

What was the connection between the angel's words, and Malachi's prophecy?

What did Zechariah prophesy after the birth of his son?

Personal: What do all of these prophecies show you about God's heart and his purposes?

Interlude: He is Here Matthew 1:18-25

How did Matthew connect his biography of Jesus to the Hebrew prophecies?

What difference does it make knowing Jesus was part of the story from the start?

What does it mean that Jesus is "the law and the prophets fulfilled" (Matthew 5:17)?

Chapter 20 Shepherds: Covenant Good News John 10:1-18

Why do you think God chose shepherds for Jesus' "birth announcement"?

What is the covenant significance of "the lamb of God"?

What is the connection between Ezekiel 34 and John 10?

Personal: Do you resonate with being the "other sheep from a borrowed story"? Why or why not?

Chapter 21

Passover: Cup of the Covenant

Luke 22:14-20, 39-46

What do you think it would have been like to follow Jesus during his 3 years of ministry?

What did the disciples experience at that final Passover meal?

Why do you think Jesus begged the Father to "remove this cup"?

How do you understand the necessity of blood in light of covenant?

Personal: What was Jesus willing to do—for you?

Chapter 22

Breath: Covenant Spirit Luke 24:36-53 & Acts 1:4-11

Why didn't the disciples understand what Jesus was doing (prior to the cross)—in spite of his repeated explanations?

How did Jesus explain the Scriptures to his disciples after his resurrection?

How did Jesus prepare his disciples for his departure? What did the disciples need to wait for and why?

Personal: Has there been an "aha" moment for you as you've walked with Jesus?
