God's second covenant with Abraham was two-sided, or bilateral. Why do you think God asked Abraham to join him in this relationship?

What promises were added in the second covenant with Abraham?

How was circumcision the "sign" of the covenant? What did it mean?

Why did God change Abram's name?

Personal: What does it mean to be a friend of God?

Chapter 7 Belief: Mark of the Covenant Genesis 22:1-19

What is righteousness?

What did trust look like for Abraham when he was asked to sacrifice Isaac? What did trust look like for Isaac?

What does the story of Abraham and Isaac foreshadow?

Personal: What has trust looked like in your own relationship with God?

Chapter 8 Wait: Covenant Assurance Genesis 39:20-23 & 45:4-8

Why do you think God included a reference to Israel's bondage in his covenant promise to Abraham (Genesis 15:12-14)?

How was hesed a part of Joseph's story? What makes his story remarkable?

Why might the theme of slavery be important to the covenant story?

Personal: When has waiting led to doubt in your life?
